US Agency for International Development (USAID)**

Appointed by President Bush in July 2001, confirmed by the U.S. Senate in Nov 2001, to head the health activities of the world's premier development agency. As the only senior administration appointee with extensive international health experience, have been integral in guiding and formulating the U.S. government's international health policies.

- Oversees policy and technical implementation of \$2.0 billion in health programs in over 100 countries. Revised and updated USAID's strategies in HIV/AIDS prevention, care and treatment, prevention of mother-to-child transmission, family planning, maternal and child health programs (immunization, nutrition, malaria, TB, diarrhea, pneumonia prevention and treatment, policy and health systems financing and reform).
- Lead USG agency to fund research, develop policies and programs establishing the ABC (Abstinence, Be Faithful, the correct and consistent use of Condoms) approach as central to HIV/AIDS prevention programs.
- Established Faith-based taskforce which later linked closely with the new President's Office of Faith-Based and Community Initiatives. Facilitated non-traditional implementers, including faith-based organizations, access to USAID funding. Designed "New Partners Fund".
- Oversees and implements all USAID activities in support of the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief (PEPFAR). Serves on principals' task force for the Global AIDS Coordinator.
- Serves as U.S. representative for the Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI), the Global Alliance for Improved Nutrition (GAIN), Stop TB, Child Survival Partnership, Health Metrix and the Global Fund for AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria (GFATM).
- Emphasizes data-based policy design, problem-focused research including wide diffusion of successful innovations, economic analysis to prioritize health interventions and show impact as investments for sustainable development and poverty reduction.
- New initiatives in linking crisis country response to sustainable health development programs, interventions to maintain healthy workforce, "life extending therapy" for HIV/AIDS, zinc for diarrhea, malaria, pneumonia treatment and prevention, expansion of safe drinking water programs.
- Major instigator of new Child Survival Partnership working at global and national level to revitalize child survival efforts and help countries meet the Child Health millennium development goal.
