



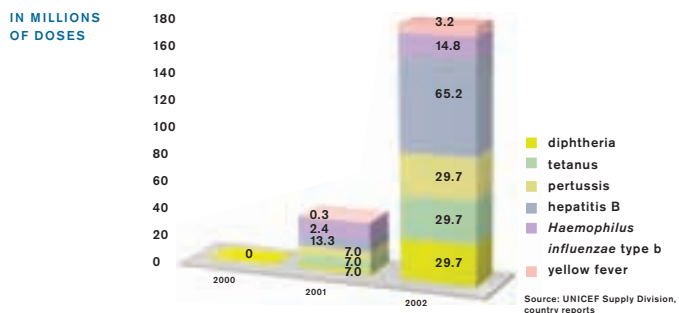

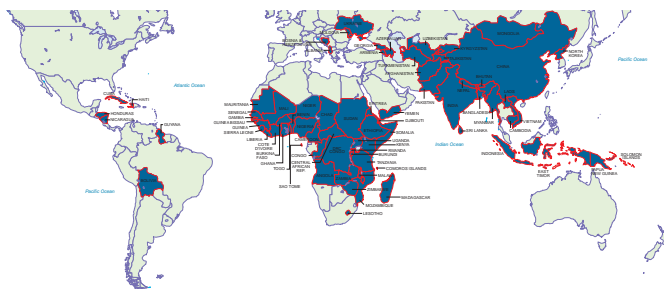
### VACCINES DELIVERED (CUMULATIVE)

10.5 million children have been protected against hepatitis B  
 3.2 million children have been protected against *Haemophilus influenzae* type b  
 600,000 children have been protected against yellow fever



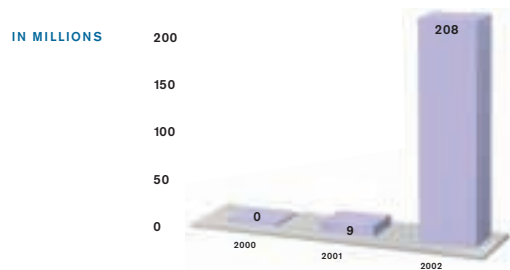
### COUNTRIES ELIGIBLE FOR SUPPORT

In May 2000:  
 GAVI invited 74 countries with less than \$1000 per capita annual Gross National Product - to submit proposals for financing.  
 In 2002 East Timor was added.



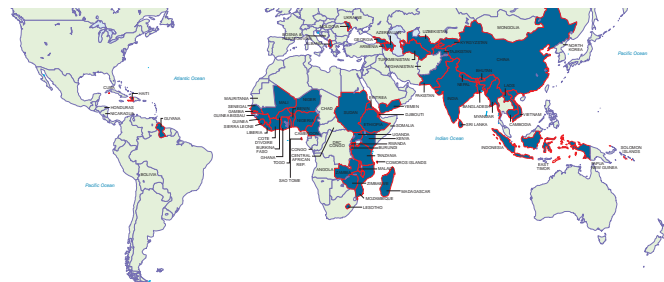
### SAFETY SYRINGES DELIVERED (CUMULATIVE)

Use of nonsterile needles can increase risk of HIV and hepatitis B infection.  
 Auto-disable syringes can only be used only once, increasing safety.



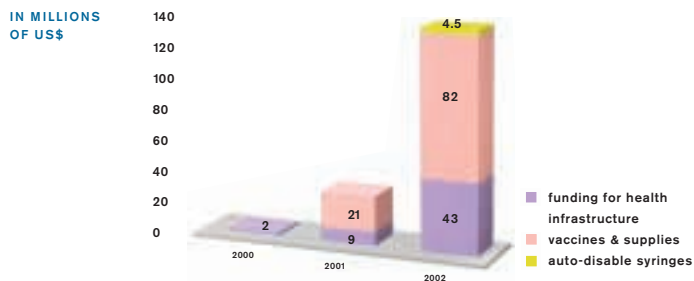
### COUNTRIES RECEIVING SUPPORT 2002

By the end of 2002:  
 33 more countries are able to protect their children against hepatitis B  
 7 more countries provide vaccine protection against *Haemophilus influenzae* type b  
 7 more provide routine vaccination of infants against yellow fever  
 50 countries receive financial support to improve healthcare infrastructure

Total value of disbursements = \$130 million



### TARGETS AND RESULTS 2001

Some countries surpassed their immunization targets while others have not yet realized their goals. Countries above the diagonal line immunized *more* children than they had projected for 2001; countries which did not achieve their targets, are below.
